

End of course test format – Dipendenti – B1

- The end of course test is made up of two parts: a written part and a speaking part.

The written part

- You will have to present a **written portfolio**. You can organize your portfolio any way you want. In your portfolio you can address some or all of the following topics:

Tell me a bit about yourself;

Where do you live?

Do you like where you live or would you like to live somewhere else?

Where are you from?

Who do you live with?

Do you have any pets?

What do you do? (job)/What's your job?

Where do you work?

How do you get to work? By car? On foot?

How long does it take you to get to work?

Can you tell me how to get from the CLI to where you work?

What is your favourite time of year? Why?

What is your favourite food or dish?

What does your daily routine at work look like?
What do you like to wear to work and what do you wear in your freetime or at the weekends?
What do you like to do in your freetime?
If you had more freetime, how would you spend it?
Where do you usually like to go on holiday?
Where are you going to go on holiday this summer?
Can you tell me about one of the most enjoyable holidays you have been on?

- Your portfolio will be a min of 500 words long up to a maximum of 1000 words.
- You are expected to carry out the written part at home in your own time and at your own pace; you may use all the resources you wish to support your writing (AI, dictionaries, etc.).
- Your portfolio needs to be handed in by the second last lesson on the **24th July**.
- Your written portfolio will be used as a starting point for our conversation at the speaking part of our End of Course test.

The speaking part

- The speaking part of our test will take place during the final two lessons of the course (**on the 24th and on the 31st**) according to who is present.

- The speaking part is a 5-10 minute conversation with me. I will ask you to talk about/comment on your portfolio as a starting point. I will then ask you to talk about one of your favourite photos and your favourite song. Please bring a **photo** to talk about and print out the **lyrics** of the song you will be presenting.
